Use of BCFPD licensed radio frequencies in mobile and portable radios acquired by Fire District personnel.

1. It is against Boone County Fire District policy to possess and operate a two-way mobile or portable radio with frequencies licensed to the Boone County Fire Protection District without a permit issued by the Fire Chief. Permits for such use can be obtained through the Strategic Planning and Preparedness Bureau.
2. Fire District personnel that receive such permits are restricted from transmitting on BCFPD licensed frequencies except under the following circumstances:
 - a. If you encounter an unreported emergency situation, you may immediately report the emergency situation by radio to Public Safety Joint Communications (PSJC). You may establish command in accordance with the BCFPD ICS SOP, provide additional information and respond to requests for further information from PSJC and/or responding BCFPD units.
 - b. If you are the first radio-equipped BCFPD member to arrive on the scene of a reported or dispatched emergency incident, you may establish command in accordance with the BCFPD ICS SOP, provide additional information and respond to requests for further information from PSJC and/or responding BCFPD units.
 - c. You may engage in official short-range emergency communications relative to a specific BCFPD operation on the orange, yellow or gold channels only when specifically authorized by the incident commander or a subordinate line officer. This authorization shall apply to the operational period of the incident and ends when the incident commander terminates the incident.
 - d. You may engage in official short-range official communications relative to a specific BCFPD training or other administrative or support activity on the orange, yellow or gold channels only when specifically authorized by the person in charge of the training program or activity. This authorization shall apply to the operational period of the specific activity and ends when the activity leader terminates the activity.
3. Cellular phones calls to PSJC shall not be made by firefighters from their vehicles unless critical information must be relayed or additional resources must be requested that will have a significant impact on the final outcome of the incident.
